Geocaching Introductory Workshop

The workshop will be provided by Cindy Perry, a local geocacher who, with her husband, has found over 650 local caches and maintains one cache. In this workshop, we'll explore the basics, including using a GPS unit, setting your own cache, and practice finding up to four special caches hidden around the CYC offices. We'll also do a little "Caching In, Trashing Out" while we are at it.



Fifteen GPS units will be on hand for you to use during the workshop thanks to Polk County Conservation. If you have a handheld unit, please bring it.



Geocaching is a fantastic activity for families, afterschool and residential programs, and school groups who want to practice math/geography skills, teamwork, get active, explore the community, and support the environment through the "Cache In, Trash Out" program.
