uVoice: Youth Philanthropy Board is a group of 15 Polk County high school students who join together to identify public health issues facing youth in our community and to combat those issues through grant-making and service learning. The 2021/2022 Board chose to focus on health issues specifically impacting immigrant and refugee youth and families. They received a record number, of thirteen, applications for their funding and ultimately awarded grants to Camp Fire Heart of Iowa, Child Future International, and Urbandale Community Action Network. All programs support enrichment opportunities for immigrants and refugee students in central Iowa. 




